WHAT IS TRAP-NEVTER-RETURN (TNR)?



The TNR process is straightforward, community cats are humanely trapped and taken to a veterinary clinic.



At the clinic, they are spayed or neutered and vaccinated for rabies, as well as the most common viral infections present in outdoor cat populations.



They are eartipped at the clinic, which is a universal indicator that a cat has undergone TNR.



Afterward, they are returned to their familiar outdoor environments, allowing them to live out their lives where they are already well-adapted and thriving.

WHAT MAKES TNR THE (OMPASSIONATE (HOI(E FOR FERAL (ATS?

Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) is recognized as the only humane and effective method for managing community cats, which are unowned cats living outdoors. Scientific studies have demonstrated that TNR effectively reduces community cat populations by halting the breeding cycle, preventing the birth of new kittens. This approach not only stabilizes cat populations but also



Alleviates community concerns



Decreases shelter intake



Decreases euthanasia rates



Reduces calls to animal control services, ultimately saving taxpayer dollars

When community cats are spayed or neutered, they no longer engage in mating behaviors, which significantly reduces noise from yowling, fighting, and spraying. This leads to better relationships between cats and nearby residents. Additionally, spaying and neutering prevent certain reproductive diseases, improving the overall health of the cats.

TNR has been successfully implemented in various settings across the United States and globally, from urban to rural areas and in different climates. Communities that adopt TNR, whether through grassroots efforts or official policies, have seen significant positive impacts.



In Cook County, Illinois, a large-scale TNR program led to a **41% reduction** in cat colony sizes across multiple zip codes over five years. We hope to help Milwaukee achieve similar success with the Cats at Large Program.

Overall, TNR is a sustainable and compassionate solution that benefits both cats and communities. It demonstrates that humane and ethical population control is achievable and effective in various environments.

TARGETED TNR

Cats at Large is a Targeted TNR organization. We use data reports from local shelters and animal control to strategically plan and schedule trapping projects throughout the Milwaukee area. This helps us maximize the impact of our sterilization efforts and more effectively manage the community cat population.
